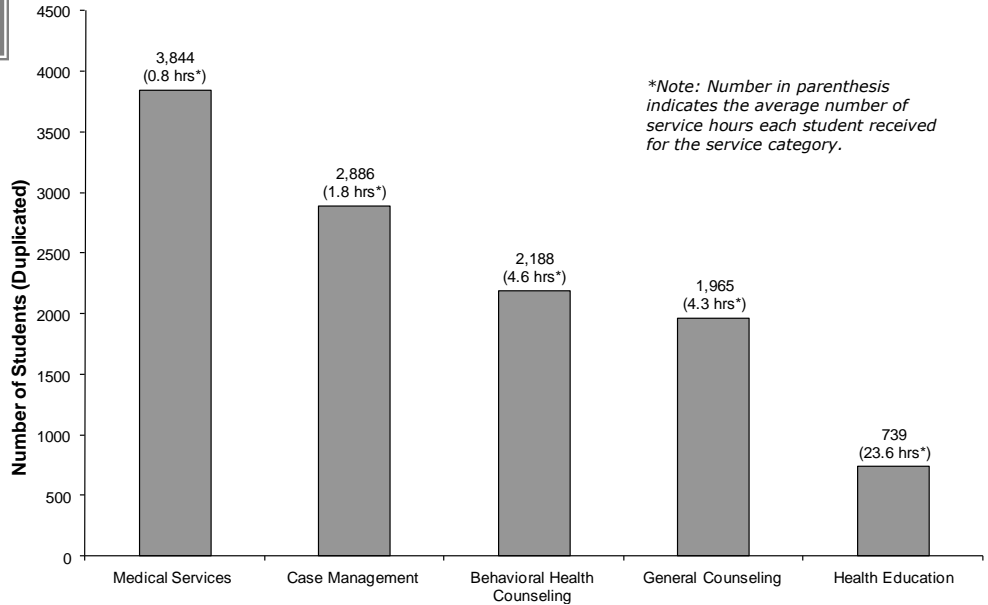


Total Number of Youth Served	7,487 [Non-Duplicated] 51% of 14,825 (the student population across all 15 sites in 11-12)

TYPES OF SERVICE

- The top three most accessed services were *medical services* (51% of all youth served by the initiative), *case management* (39%), and *behavioral health counseling* (29%). The top five service categories are shown in Chart 1.
- The most time intensive service provided was *health education*, where youth received an average of 23.6 hours of service through support and empowerment groups.



PARTICIPANT DEMOGRAPHICS

- Demographic data on the racial/ethnic groups served are presented in Chart 2. Latino students made up 29% of the students served across all fifteen sites, Chinese students made up 27% of the students served, and African American students made up 15% of the students served.
- The top 5 zip codes of students served across the Wellness Programs include Ingleside/Excelsior, Bayview, Visitacion Valley, Mission, and the Sunset (Chart 3).

Chart 2: Comparison of Student Race/Ethnicity in School and Wellness Program Population

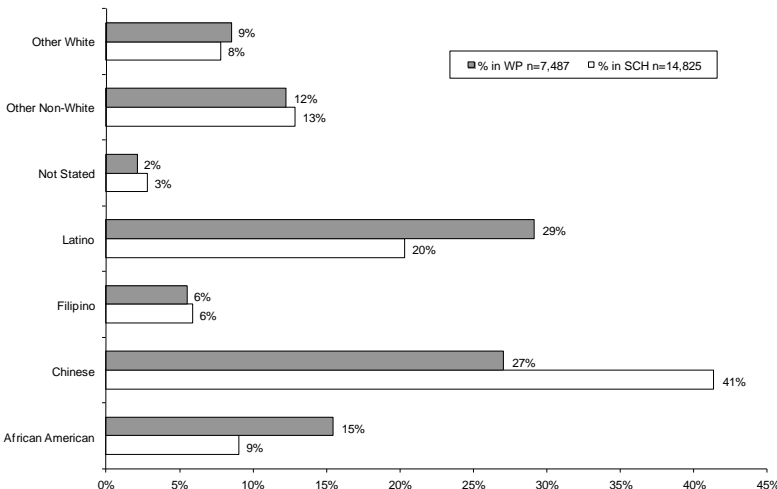
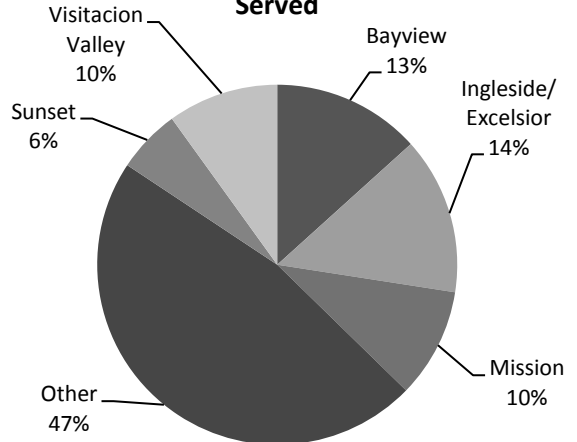


Chart 3: Top 5 Zip Codes of Students Served

The SFUSD and CMS information reflects data available during the 2011-12 school year. In Chart 1, Medical Services refers to services primarily provided by the School Nurse. Behavioral health counseling refers to clinical counseling services provided by a licensed or license-eligible counselor. General Counseling refers to non-clinical counseling provided by non-licensed staff.
