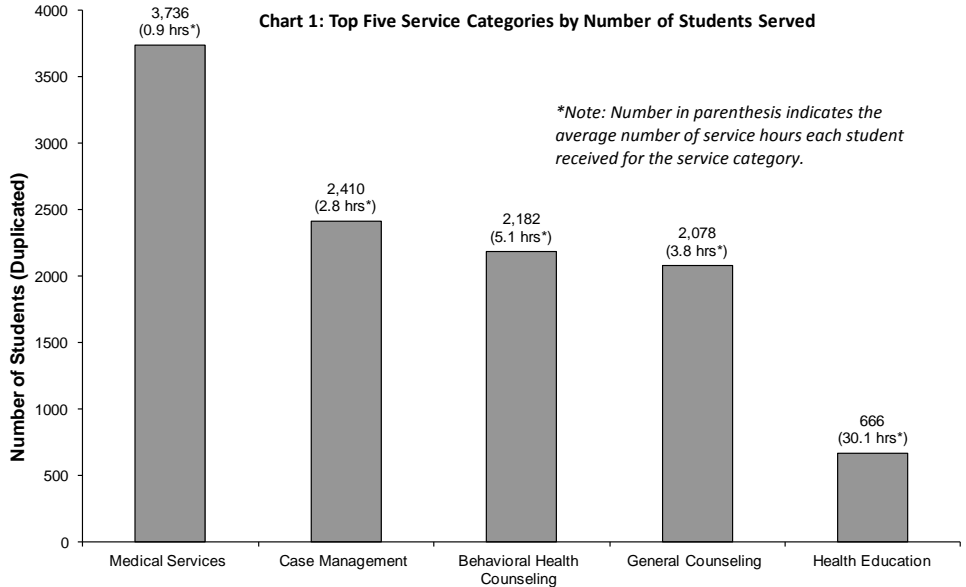

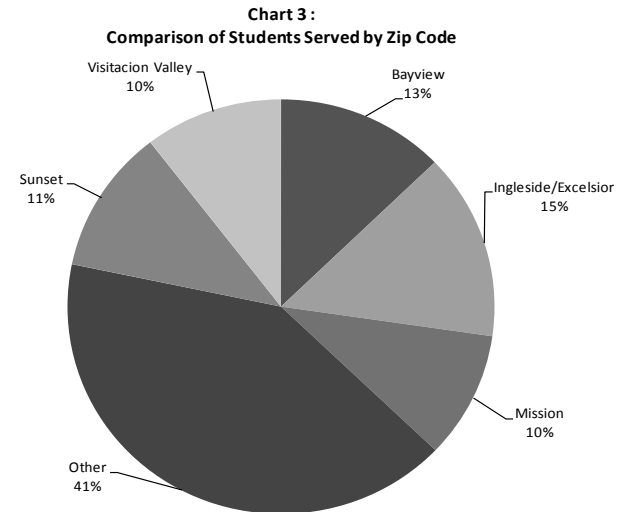
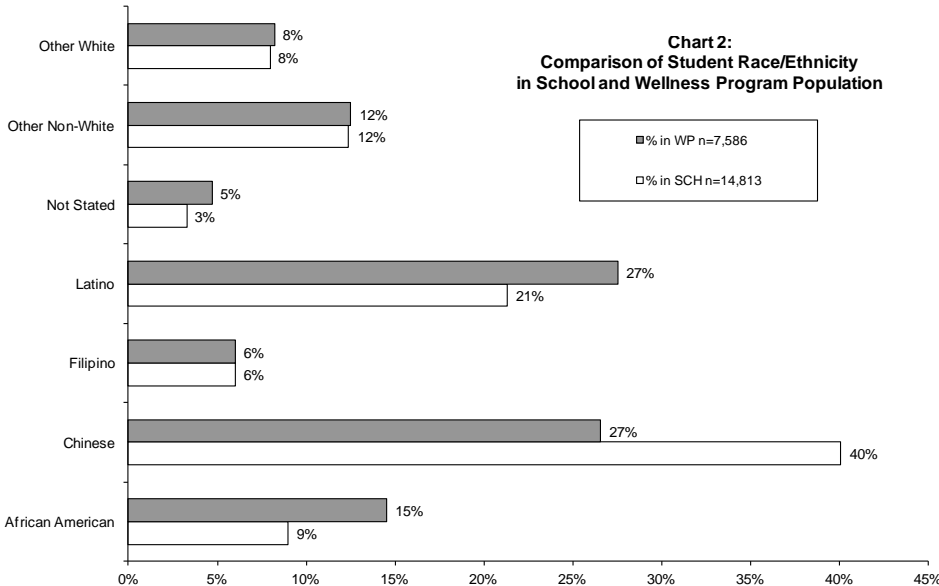
TYPES OF SERVICE

- The top three most accessed services were *medical services* (49% of all youth served by the initiative), *case management* (32%), and *behavioral health counseling* (29%). The top five service categories are shown in Chart 1.
- The most time intensive service provided was *health education*, where youth received an average of 30.1 hours of service through support and empowerment groups.



PARTICIPANT DEMOGRAPHICS

- Demographic data on the racial/ethnic groups served are presented in Chart 2. Latino and Chinese students each made up 27% of the students served across all eighteen sites, and African American students made up 15% of the students served.
- The top five zip codes of students served across the Wellness Programs include Ingleside/Excelsior, Bayview, Sunset, Visitacion Valley, and the Mission (Chart 3).



Data for Charts 1, 2 and 3 was obtained from the Contract Management System (CMS) managed by the San Francisco Department of Children, Youth and Their Families and School Site Profiles from the San Francisco Unified School District at www.sfusd.edu. The SFUSD and CMS information reflects data available during the 2012-13 school year. In Chart 1, Medical Services refers to services primarily provided by the School Nurse. Behavioral health counseling refers to clinical counseling services provided by a licensed or license-eligible counselor. General Counseling refers to non-clinical counseling provided by non-licensed staff.
