

## The top three most accessed services were general counseling (59% of all youth served), medical services (41%), and behavioral health counseling (37%). The top five service categories are shown in Chart 1.

TYPES OF SERVICE

The most time intensive service provided was youth leadership development, where youth received average of 19.3 hours of service through the Youth Outreach Program pictured in Chart 1).



PARTICIPANT DEMOGRAPHICS

- Demographic data on the racial/ethnic groups served are presented in Chart 2. Chinese students made up 34% of the students served, Latino students made up 29% of the students served, and African American students made up 25% of the students served.
- The Wellness Program served more male students than female students (Chart 3).
