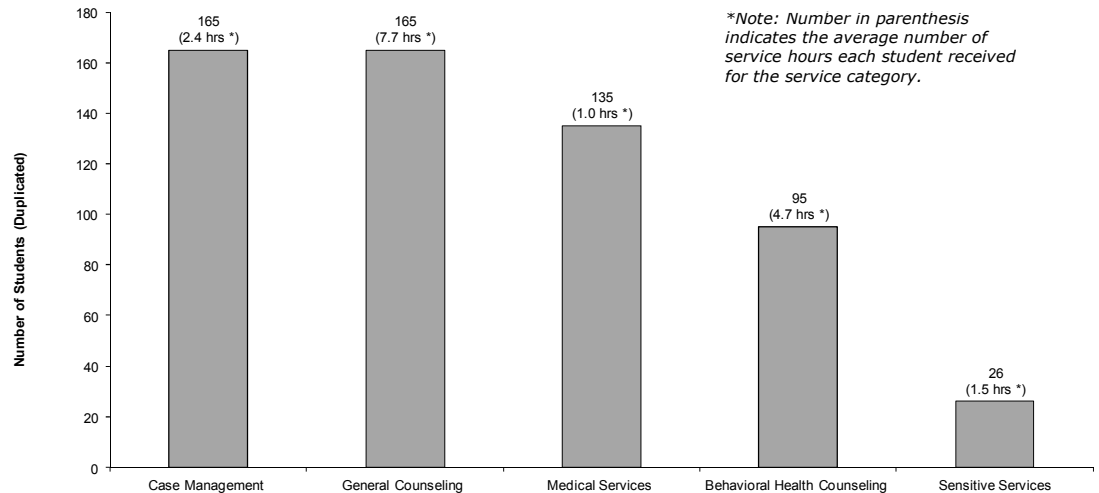

TYPES OF SERVICE

Chart 1: Top Five Service Categories by Number of Students Served

- The top three most accessed services were *case management* (61% of all youth served), *general counseling* (61%), and *medical services* (50%). The top five service categories are shown in Chart 1.
- The most time intensive service provided was *youth leadership development*, where youth received an average of 23.4 hours of service through the Youth Outreach Program (not pictured in Chart 1).



PARTICIPANT DEMOGRAPHICS

- Demographic data on the racial/ethnic groups served are presented in Chart 2. Latino students made up 48% of the students served, Chinese students made up 39% of the students served, and Other Non-White students made up 5% of the students served.
- The Wellness Program served more males students than female students (Chart 3).

Chart 2: Comparison of Student Race/Ethnicity in School and Wellness Program Population

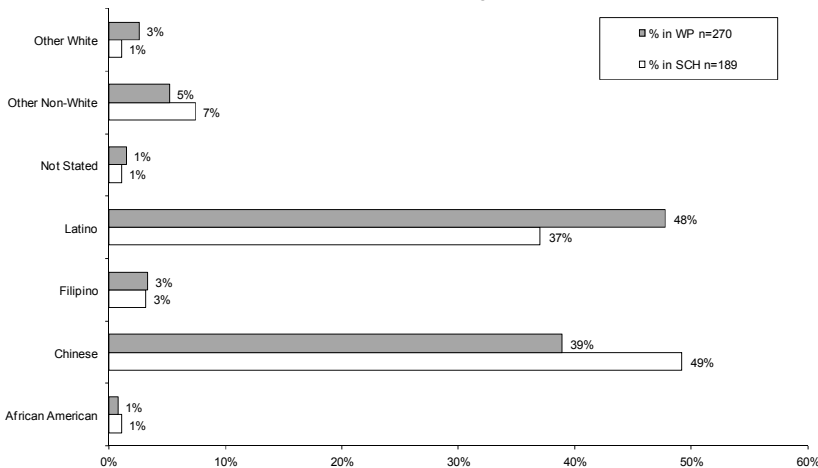
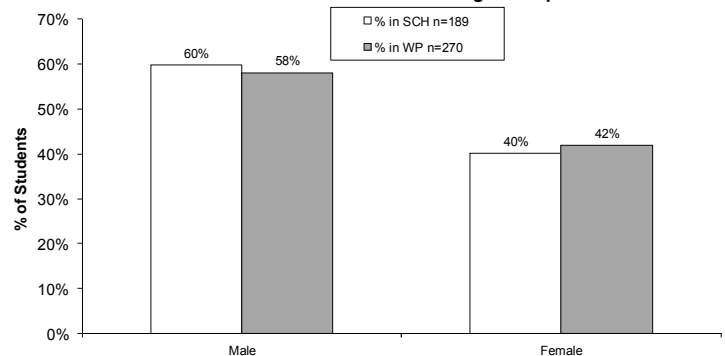


Chart 3: Comparison of Student Gender in School and Wellness Program Populations



Data for Charts 1, 2 and 3 was obtained from the Contract Management System (CMS) managed by the San Francisco Department of Children, Youth and Their Families and School Site Profiles from the San Francisco Unified School District at www.sfusd.edu. The SFUSD and CMS information reflects data available during the 2011-12 school year. In Chart 1, General Counseling refers to non-clinical counseling provided by non-licensed staff. Sensitive Services refers to reproductive health services. Medical Services refers to services primarily provided by the School Nurse. Behavioral Health Counseling refers to clinical counseling services provided by a licensed or license-eligible counselor. Sensitive Services refers to reproductive health services.

* Students can be placed at SF International throughout the school year, thus the number of students increases as the year progresses, however student enrollment figures are based on data from October 2011.
